

PARTNERING WITH SACF

Through Community Impact Grants

Eligibility Requirements

- The Foundation will only make grants to federal 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organizations, government entities, school districts, and universities.
- While grants to religious organizations are considered, sectarian religious programs are not eligible.
- We do not make grants to individuals or grants to cover deficits or other previously incurred obligations.
- We will only grant to entities that have submitted all final reports that are due to the Foundation on previous grants they have received from us.
- Grants must serve residents of the communities in St. Joseph County, Michigan.

High Impact Projects

Energy

There's a clear enthusiasm and passion for the project.

Expertise

The statement of need reflects a deep understanding of the problem being addressed and the plan and program is contrasted with expertise from the field.

Clarity

The goals and objectives for the projects are measurable and the evaluation plan for the project is clear and outcome-based.

Collaboration

The organization has formed collaborative and cooperative relationships as appropriate in order to advance their mutual goals.

Comprehensiveness

The complexity of the program is matched by the sophistication of the proposed solution.

Effectiveness

There is a plan in place to measure the success of meeting the project's goals and objectives.
